Minutes of the June Meetings – *Tenho Tuomi*

Minutes of the June 20 Executive Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Les Dickson at 7:04 pm.

Moved by Norma Jensen and Darrell Chatfield that the minutes of the May 16 executive meeting be accepted as circulated. Carried.

Reports:

- President's report by Les Dickson spoke at the Regina Centre meeting two weeks ago, 20 people were present.
- Treasurer's report by Norma Jensen asked about quotes from electricians for work at Sleaford. First electrician could not continue, looking for quotes from second electrician.
- Newsletter report next issue will come out in September.
- Sleaford Site Co-ordinator's report by Darrell Chatfield have a quote of \$1200.00 for demolition of old observatory. After discussion it was decided to table a decision to the September meeting. We should get a quote from the Municipality for disposing of the rubble and do it ourselves. More talk about mouse proofing the roll-off.
- Activities report by Rick Huziak about 30 people attended the Grasslands East Star Party on May 27/28. About 160 people attended the Old Man on his Back Nocturnal Preserve signing on June 18 with people from the Eastend Astro Club, our two Centres, and the Nature Conservancy of Canada. Our Centres contributed to the donation of an 8" Dobsonian. A plow wind flattened the meeting tent.
- Librarian's report by Darrell Chatfield need a key?
- Scope Rental Coordinator's report by Errol Frazer-Harrison Mike Duffy has one telescope for repairs.
- SSSP committee report by Les Dickson and Rick Huziak still need two more volunteers. The two red lights have been installed. All supplies have been checked.

New Business:

- Candice Dustine needs someone for star nights at North Battleford. Rick Huziak volunteered.
- There was a discussion about dropping our \$10 Centre surcharge and instead charging \$25.00 for the 15-16 who want a printed newsletter, in the hope of attracting more members.
- There was discussion about moving our meeting place to the campus observatory. Some problems were seen as limited parking space, and question about whether enough room can be made there by knocking out a wall. It was suggested that we set up an exploratory meeting with Gordon Sarty and the University's Science Outreach Program to see if we can work more together.
