Minutes of the September Meetings

Minutes of the September 19 Executive Meetings

The meeting was called to order by President Les Dickson @ 7:05 pm

Present: Les Dickson, Ellen Dickson, Larry Scott, Mark De Jong, Rob Shepard, Norma Jensen, Kris Ohnander, Erroll Frazer-Harrison, James Gorkoff (guest), Gordon Sarty (guest).

Moved by Rob Shepard and seconded by Larry Scott that the minutes of the June 20 Executive meeting be accepted as circulated. Carried.

Reports:

Rick Huziak spoke about renovations at Sleaford: The roll-off is clean from mice. The dome is to be demolished and the rubble pile to be removed in October.

Kris Ohnander set the next deadline for newsletter items on October 7. He mentioned that Brian Clark Alan School requested help for a school open house with star night.

Larry Scott is organizing the Sleaford Open House (along with Stan Shadick) scheduled for October 24. He would appreciate some volunteers to help out. The members' pot luck to start at 4:30 pm and the guests from the city to arrive by convoy from the Field House at 7:30 pm. The Observers' Group is scheduled for October 1. There was some discussion of sending out a general e-mail to members each month to alert people of upcoming Observers' Group dates; this will be tried in October.

Mark De Jong reported that we had now 79 regular members and 5 family members.

Rob Shepard mentioned professor from Western U. (Dr. Livio Tornabene) who might make a good speaker for a meeting.

Old Business:

Les Dickson would like us to restructure our fees to eliminate the Centre surcharge as it is now and ask each person who wants a printed copy of the newsletter to pay full cost of printing and mailing: \$25/year. There was some discussion. To provide more facts on which to base further discussions, Jim Gorkoff will supply info on the last 15 years of income and expenditures.

Gordon Sarty and Les Dickson talked about a meeting they had with Lana Elias, Director of Outreach at the College of Arts and Science, U of S about collaboration in science outreach. Gordon thought that the University might be a source of funds for bringing in speakers for our meetings and could provide some support for SSSP as part of science outreach. There are possibilities to explore but most ideas are somewhat nebulous at the moment. Les, Erroll and Gordon will try to keep discussions going to see where this might lead.

New Business:

Norma Jensen reported that the invoice from the University for the shared Sleaford site costs for 2015-2016 has been paid.

Larry Scott presented a motion to have the Executive approve a yearly expenditure of \$200 for on-going maintenance for yard equipment at Sleaford. Seconded by Norma Jensen. Carried.

Saskatoon Centre Executive Election October 2016

Each fall, in October or November, we hold our Annual General Meeting and Election for the Executive. We elect certain members of the Executive, and appoint others. A list of current holders of such offices are given below at the end of this article.

This past year has been difficult with a number of positions left un-occupied. We also have a few Executive members who are stepping down. The significant positions of President, Vice-President, Secretary and Events Coordinator are open. Les Dickson, who was elected for one year as President to

finish out Jim Goodridge's two-year term, is stepping down. Tenho Tuomi, who has worked very hard as our Secretary for many years, would like to step down. We have not had a Vice-President for two years or more. Dale Boan is stepping down as our Activities Coordinator.

On the positive side, Norma Jensen has agreed to continue as Treasurer if elected, and Rob Shepherd has agreed to continue as National Advisory Council Representative if elected. Kris Ohnander would like to continue as Newsletter Coordinator, and Errol Frazer-Harrison has would like to continue as Telescope Rental Coordinator and Councillor-at-Large. Larry Scott would like to continue as Observing Coordinator. Mark De Jong would like to continue as Membership Coordinator. Other positions at this time are to be determined.

It is disappointing that very few members are willing to step up and help run the Centre. I was unable to even get more than Ellen Dickson to volunteer to be part of a committee to find candidates for the open Executive. I stand by my statement at the last meeting that I would not even consider accepting a nomination to continue as President as long as we did not have the crucial positions of Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and National Advisory Council Representative filled. There could be implications with regards to our standing as a functioning Centre of the national organization, and perhaps implications with regards to our status as a corporation under Saskatchewan law, if we do not have a functioning and effective Executive. I encourage all of you to think about how you can participate and support the Centre. See you at the meeting October 17th.

The Perseid Meteor Shower — Tenho Tuomi

On the morning of August 12 I took 250 20-second pictures from 00:52 to 02:37 local time with a Canon T5i camera set at ISO 3200 and a 10-20mm Sigma lens set at 10mm and F/3.5, and caught 7 meteors. On the morning of August 13 I took 257 pictures from 01:25 to 02:58 but raised the ISO to 6400 and caught 10 meteors. Camera was on a driven EQ2 mount.
