	"What's up with Astronomy at USask" - Daryl Janzen (description below)							

## WHAT'S UP WITH ASTRONOMY AT THE U OF S? Daryl Janzen

The popularity of astronomy courses at USask has increased significantly, with a more than 300% increase to enrolments in the past decade, so that astronomy classes now account for more than a third of enrolments in the Department of Physics and Engineering Physics (as opposed to 2-3% of departmental enrolments twenty years ago). Over the past five years, astronomy has been the most popular specialisation within our honours physics programme, and this year our recently-created Astronomy Certificate will reach its first dozen graduates. Throughout this period, we've engaged in several major projects ranging from education and public outreach, to facilities enhancements, to research at all levels, from 100-level course-based projects to record-breaking research with the Hubble and James Webb Space Telescopes, building successful collaborations across campus and the globe. In this talk, I will give an overview of the past, current and planned future projects that contribute to the continued success of our astronomy programme.





# Brief job descriptions for the Executive and Support positions on the Executive Council and for the Board of Directors.

#### National Executive Positions

President – Runs the Centre meetings and coordinates and directs the general affairs of the Centre guided by our Constitution and National norms. The President is generally the contact and spokesperson for the Centre, unless delegated.

Vice-President – Assistant to the President and assumes those duties in the absence of the President. This is expected to be a "grooming" or "learning" position and a step up to President in two years.

Secretary – Records the Minutes of the Executive and General meetings of the Centre, maintains the centre records, manages the Centre mailbox, maintains the document archive and writes the National Year-end Report.

Treasurer – Manages the financial affairs of the Centre, keeps the financial books, issues and receives payments, interfaces with the bank maintaining accounts and investments, interfaces with the Provincial Government for not-for-profit status registration, creates balance sheets, income statements and the year-end statement for the Centre and the Provincial Government. Maintains all records for insurance purposes such as premium payments, processing of all insurance claims, obtaining event certificates and all other documents pertaining to insurance. Maintains all records of the SSSP, all payments, invoices, and other documentation pertaining to the SSSP.

National Council Rep – Represents the Centre at the National Council meetings quarterly, either in person or virtually. Is expected to express Centre concerns to National and to relay National news to the Centre. In-person travel to the meetings and General Assembly (not fully required) is reimbursed.

Note that RASC National requires us to have a President, Secretary, Treasurer and National Council Rep to be in good standing with National.

#### **Support Positions**

Activities Coordinator – Plans, books and manages outreach activities of the Centre and reports those plans to the Executive for approval. Solicits help in conducting outreach activates and assures proper permitting and insurance is in place, as applicable.

Librarian/Archivist – Maintains the library of the RASC (located in the basement of the University Observatory.)

Meeting Room Coordinator – Assures the in-person meeting room (175 Physics) is booked for the monthly meetings. Sets up refreshments (coffee and snacks) and ensures supplies for such are maintained.

Membership Coordinator – Interfaces with National RASC to maintain the accurate listing of Centre Members and their status.

Newsletter Editor – Solicits articles and speaker/meeting information for the newsletter, edits and publishes the Saskatoon Skies newsletter on-line monthly from September through June, and once or twice over the summer as requested. Arranges for upload of the newsletter to the Centre website.

Newsletter Printer/Mailer – Prints and mails those newsletters going to those members who request printed copies as well as copies to the Saskatoon Public Library System.

Observing Certificate Coordinator – Certifies that observers have completed the requirement of Observing Certificates and provides completion certificates for the observers, interfacing with National observing programs where required.

Observers Group Coordinator(s) – Can be one or two coordinators. – Arranges dates of Centre observing nights monthly and the fall Sleaford Open House. Generally, goes to the Sleaford Observatory to open and close up for observing nights and has traditionally arranged for snow removal and grass cutting as required, though these tasks can be delegated. Trains new Sleaford users and issues keys to Sleaford to qualified members.

Past President – Inherited position after being President. Is an advisor to the President. Photographer(s) – Takes photos as requested to document Centre activities, including the Saskatchewan Summer Star Party

Sleaford Maintenance Coordinators – Coordinates maintenance of the Sleaford buildings, equipment, and grounds to assure the site does not deteriorate faster than it should. Conducts repairs and maintenance as required but can also solicit help as required or arrange for contractors on approval.

Sleaford Joint Site Management Committee – Two representatives from the Centre and two representatives from the Department of Physics and Engineering Physics jointly manage the Sleaford site to the benefit of both parties according to the Memorandum of Agreement (2002). This committee meets at least once a year, more often as required.

Social Media Coordinator – Create content and maintains the Centre's Facebook & Instagram pages.

Speaker Coordinator – Solicits speakers for the Monthly General meetings for September through June. Speakers are announced in the Newsletter and Activities Page. Provides (external) speakers with compensation per the approved budget, as required.

SSSP Organizing Committee Chair – Coordinates the initiation, planning, execution & closing of the annual Saskatchewan Summer Star Party through the Organizing Committee that includes members of the Saskatoon and Regina Centres.

Telescope Rental Coordinators – Maintains the rental telescopes, loans the telescopes, and receives payment for the loaner telescope use.

Web Master – This position is in flux and requires discussion as many of the positions functions are covered by the Website Owner/Manager (below)

Website Owner/Manager – Maintains the Centre website and uploads content on demand.

Web Content Editor – Assures the content of the Centre website is current and accurate and uploads content changes or clarification on demand.

## **Board of Directors**

Assures the Centre is operating within their Constitution and that this is being conducted with good intention and good faith. Provides guidance where required if of questions of operation and governance arise. The Board in theory appoints the Officers of the Centre but in practice does so based on the will of the membership of the Centre as expressed in the annual elections.

## MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER MEETINGS Les Dickson

Minutes of the Monthly Executive Meeting of the RASC Saskatoon Centre Monday, Sept. 18, 2023 – 7:00 pm Hybrid: In-person Room Phys 175 & Online

1. Call to order: 7:02 pm – Les Dickson (President and Chair)

## 2. Call for additional announcements/items to add to agenda

**3.** Approval of Executive meeting minutes for June 2023 as printed in the Summer newsletter: Moved by Les Dickson, seconded by Brent Burlingham; Carried.

## 4. Announcements from the Chair – Les Dickson

The low attendance at the meeting was noted. It was the consensus of those present that we did not have a quorum so no substantive decisions could be made. However, as reported below, a motion was made on payment of an insurance premium.

## 5. President's Report - Les Dickson

Les reviewed his email outlining his resignation from various positions. Noted that Jim Gorkoff was willing to continue to work on the by-laws and policies and that Les would assist.

## 6. Reports from the Executive Council

- **6.1** Acting Treasurer Les Dickson
  - Les reported that the General Account has a balance of approx. \$21,500, the SSSP Account has a balance of approx. \$15,300, the Term Deposit is approx. \$2,260. When members join or renew, National transfers \$33 minus a fee of \$0.99, giving the Centre \$32.01 per member. With 74 members, that results in an annual income from memberships of \$2,368.74. Add-ons and donations are additional income.

Acting Treasurer's motion: Moved by Les Dickson, seconded by Darrell Chatfield, that the invoice for the renewal of our Commercial Pak policy with SGI in the amount of \$1,573.04 be paid. Provisionally carried pending approval from other Executive members notified by email. If no substantial objections presented, the policy will be paid Wednesday September 20<sup>th</sup>.

- **6.2** Representative to National Council Les Dickson National has asked for Centres to place bulk orders for RASC 2024 calendars by the end of September. Les Dickson recommended that members order their own copies via National's website. There is a meeting of National Council on Sunday September 24. Les is unable to attend as he will be travelling. Brent Burlingham as agreed to attend as alternate.
- **6.3** SSSP Chair Les Dickson Les Dickson will be giving a presentation on SSSP 2023 at the General meeting.
- 6.4 Sleaford Site Coordinator Darrell Chatfield New gate was installed. Some minor repairs were required on a pin and hinge on one gate. A second set of hinges will be purchased to better take the weight of the gates. The gates cost under the budget of \$1,200. Our cost is one-half

of that amount as the University pays the other half. Brent Gratias has been cutting the grass. The riding lawnmower does not work well in the ditches, so that was finished off with a push mower. Darrell Chatfield received some key deposit money and key blanks from Larry Scott. The money will be used for maintenance of locks, rekeying, and cutting new keys. Darrell Chatfield will not be rekeying until we better know what direction the Centre will take.

6.5 Telescope Rental Coordinator - Ike Thiessen Three telescopes were rented out in August. One has been returned. Has on hand \$185 in rental fees. Chris Standing and Wyatt Brown of Dakota Dunes (have at times rented scopes) are members of the Centre and have expressed interest in attending meetings.

## 7. Old Business

7.1 Request by Ron Waldron to change wording of the motion made in May 2023 Exec meeting.

The request by Ron Waldron to change the wording of the motion made in May 2023 Executive meeting regarding his letter was deferred due to lack of quorum.

#### 8. New Business

8.1 Sleaford Open House in October – Daryl Janzen

Daryl Janzen was to speak about the Sleaford Open House on October 14<sup>th</sup>, same day as the solar eclipse. Daryl did not attend the meeting. Any organization and coordination of the event with Centre members will have to be done by email and phone.

- **8.2** Upcoming Annual General Meeting and Election of Executive, October 16th Discussion of the upcoming Annual Meeting and Election of Executive: This meeting is currently scheduled for October 16<sup>th</sup>.
